Re: Campus Recreation Center Member Access and Privileges

The University of Cincinnati Campus Recreation Center is a premier fitness facility operated for the benefit of University of Cincinnati students, faculty, staff, and other members. Those individuals eligible for membership include:

Community residents and Families (Spouses and legal dependents of members)

Membership is granted based on payment of the appropriate student fee and/or membership fee. Membership privileges include access to the facility; use of fitness and weight machines, racquet courts, gymnasium, track, lap pool, leisure pool and whirlpool; and participation in no-fee and fee-based activities and services that include open recreation, climbing and bouldering, fitness programs, sports, and a variety of instructional programming. The Campus Recreation Center offers restricted access for those under 14 years of age.

The mission of the department of Campus Recreation is to provide, in an effective and efficient manner, a broad range of quality sport and fitness

programs designed to promote an active, healthy lifestyle and to enhance the university learning experience. In order to fulfill its mission and protect the rights and safety of all members, Campus Recreation management reserves the right to revoke or suspend membership and day pass privileges for the following reasons:

- * Failure to comply with posted or written policies;
- * Failure to pay dues or student fees; and
- * Actions that violate any federal, state, or local laws.

All UC students will be held accountable to established university policies and procedures, including the Student Code of Conduct.
